Since our last edition, Bowls NSW has revised the Grade 1 Proposal for 2015 and has now modified the competition from 16 sides to 20 sides. The full details of the changes and the draw are listed below. Zone 10 will be represented by Carlingford, Merrylands, The Hills & Wentworthville Leagues. This will mean that No 1 clubs from last year, Gladesville & Toongabbie will be relegated to No 2's next year. It was interesting the feedback I received after the changes were announced in the last "In The Zone". I received 1 email regarding the changes – at least we know Zone 10 is comfortable with the decision!!

Also there are changes to the accreditation & re- accreditation of Umpires and to the Laws of the Game that will come into effect 1st January. All umpires and intending umpires should be making themselves familiar with the new procedures as soon as possible

With most State events now completed and also most Club Championships completed, play on our club's greens is more social than competitive. It is hoped that clubs are looking forward to many businesses utilising their facilities – function rooms, bars and greens – for Xmas parties. Has your club let their local businesses know just what you offer? My motto is – 1% of something is a whole lot better than 100% of NOTHING!!! NEW SOUTH WALES No 1 Pennants - Metropolitan Pennants

The State Match Committee received feedback on the composition of the 2015 Metropolitan Pennant Competition. The State Match Committee has resolved that the competition will now comprise of twenty sides, sides elevated to or regressed from Grade 1 in line with the RNSWBA Conditions of Play.

The competition will be played as two sections of 10 sides. Each side will play the other sides in their section once.

Sides will play either:
Five matches at home and four matches away
OR
Four matches at home and five matches away

A draw has been developed that has -

Section 1 comprised of 3 sides from each of Zone 9 and Zone 11 and two sides from each of Zone 10 and Zone 12

Section 2 comprised of 3 sides from each of Zone 13 and Zone 11 and two sides from each of Zone 10 and Zone 12

The draw ensures an 'even' distribution of away venues.

Each side will play one match at home and one match away to sides from Zone 10

Each side will play one match at home and one match away to sides from Zone 12

(Except where the side is from Zone 10 or Zone 12, where their 5/4 home/away split is determined by where they play the other side from their Zone)

Each side will play sides from Zone 11 or Zone 9/13 (depending on section) having either 2 matches at home and 1 away against Zone 11 and 1 match at home and 2 away against sides from Zone 9/13

OR

1 match at home and 2 away against Zone 11 and 2 matches at home and 1 away against sides from Zone 9/13

(Where the side is from Zone 11 or 9/13, they will play one home and one away match against sides from their Zone, their draw against the other 3 side Zone determining their 5/4 home away split).

At the conclusion of the Sectional play a one day final series will be played.

Sides finishing first and second in each section will play semi finals, the semi final winners to play off in the final.

An open draw to determine which sides from each Zone are drawn in each section took place at the RNSWBA Offices on Thursday 6 November.

Some important dates have been announced by Bowls NSW & Zone 10 for 2015

The 2015 Zone 10 Pennant season will commence **Saturday 28th February** with entries closing 16th January

State Senior Inter-Zone Championships – 19th to 21st May (Host Venue Zone 9 - Harbord)

State Pennants Finals – 1st to 3rd August (Various Venues)

State Inter-Zone Championships 12th to 14th September (Host Venue Zone 15 – The Entrance)

2015 Bowls NSW - Conditions of Play

The new Conditions of Play feature some important fundamental changes including:
The Conditions of Play relating to substitutes and replacement players has been re-written. The use of replacement players is now, in line with the Laws of the Sport of Bowls, only permitted after the first round of the competition.

The allocation of points for Pennants matches has been changed. The scoring system is now consistent for sectional and post-sectional round robin play. Sides winning each match will be awarded 2 points, 1 point will be awarded for a tie and no points for a loss.

Use of substitutes and replacement players in Pennants competitions have been explained, with replacement players permitted in matches that were not completed.

Another important change for pennants is for matches that are not commenced or not completed and are being played on another day. For these matches a player who had played in that round in a lower grade may now be used to take the place of a player unavailable in a higher grade.

Players with a hearing disability may now use a communication device, with safeguards that the use of that device should not disturb players on the neighbouring rinks.

Another important change for is for practice. For all matches practice is now permitted up to 30 minutes before the start time. For Pennant matches, players may practice on any rink, but once the draw for rinks is made they may not practice on the rink on which they are drawn.

A number of other alterations have been made to ensure clarity, consistency or compliance with the Laws of the Sport.

City v Country Series



Umpires

A meeting was held last night (12th November) at Dundas Sports regarding the introduction of new procedures for the accreditation and re accreditation of Umpires to be implemented from 1st January 2015. This meeting was very well attended with over 50 in attendance and Bowls NSW speakers Leo Finn (State Umpires Committee Chairman) & Michal Beaumont (Bowls NSW Development Officer) who explained that the accreditation of umpires will be standardised, finally, over all states in Australia. Also explained was that the Umpires course, from 1st January 2015, will consist of 3 modules that will be completed over a 2 day course instead of the current drawn out course over several weeks.

The 3 modules are -

- 1. Marker
- 2. Measurer
 - 3. Umpire

If chosen, the Marker and/or Measurers modules can be done (both ½ day courses) separately or jointly, but if you chose to be accredited as an Umpire, you will be required to undertake all 3 modules (over 2 days). It is hoped that the condensing of the Umpires course, compared to the accreditation course implemented now, will assist and encourage more players to become umpires – the more that are in our clubs, the healthier the game will be.

Current umpires who are seeking to be re accredited now have until 30th November 2014 (not long!!) to re accredit under the old system. From 1st December 2014, all umpires will need to re accredit under the new system.

The gathering was also told that the Laws of the Game have been revised, in some very minor ways, with a new Laws booklet available early in 2015. As soon as it is available, notification will be published by Bowls NSW & Zone 10.

If you are ever thought about being an umpire – or a marker, or a measurer – stop thinking and start moving. You will not be disappointed – just ask any umpire – it is great to have a better understanding of the laws we play under. And by having any or all of these qualifications, you are doing your bit to keep the game alive and progressing. He has a caravan and staying at North Ryde Caravan Park while in Sydney and then moves around to other camping areas pending the clubs he plays at. He plays on the average 2 to 3 games a day mostly 7 days a week. He gets support from Men's Shed, Cancer Council Australia

His challenge started in July this year and will finish in July 2015. Currently he has played in over 350 (that is about 50 clubs since the last "In The Zone") plus clubs and another bowler is also trying the same idea only that he finishes in January 2015 & he has played 500 plus clubs to date. Chris is looking to the support of each of the bowling clubs he plays at for financial support via donations and the purchase of Cancer Council polo shirts at \$49.

Major Triples Final




Pennant Hills Notes from Martin Billam

APL snapshot

- Each team shall comprise of 3 players plus a non-playing coach
- Two players from each Team shall be nominated to compete in the game (lead/skip).
 - The third player will be the substitute for that team.
- Playing positions / order between the 3 players may be altered at any time, provided that the order must not be altered once an end has commenced.

Competition Format

- The APL will be played as a sectional based competition in the preliminary rounds and convert to a "knock out" format for all finals play
 - The event will be played in "sets play" format

Game Format - Pairs

- There will be three (3) bowls per player for each end
- Each game will be played over two sets with each set consisting of 5 ends
